Assignment:

- 1. Practice, via role play scenarios and case studies, effective outreach techniques.
- 2. Perform roles designated by the CHW scope of practice.
- 3. Maintain a journal of externship experiences, reflect on communication with supervisors, clients and peers.
- 4. Meet with instructor and outreach supervisor (1-3 times) during semester to review accomplishments and identify areas for improvement.

Methods of Evaluation/Basis of Grade:

Writing: Assessment tools that demonstrate writing skills and/or require students to select, organize and explain ideas in writing.

Journal and weekly externship documentation

Problem Solving: Assessment tools, other than exams, that demonstrate competence in computational or non-computational problem solving skills.

Case studies, role plays

Skill Demonstrations: All skill-based and physical demonstrations used for assessment purposes including skill performance exams.

Outreach experience hours, attendance and organization of resources; perform the duties allowable to the CHW scope of practice.
