Assignment:

1. Health careers fieldwork: job shadowing at local hospitals, clinics, and public health outreaches for 20-30 hours.

- 2. Lab competencies in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation for healthcare providers.
- 3. Complete communication skills workshop, including writing assignments, role playing, and

written exam.

4. Writing Assignment: Complete 5-10 medical taxonomy worksheets based on student shadow experiences.

5. Fieldwork: students participate in a Healthy Eating Active Living public health outreach utilizing nutrition and anatomy knowledge.

6. Complete 2-5 quizzes.

Methods of Evaluation/Basis of Grade:

Writing: Assessment tools that demonstrate writing skills and/or require students to select, organize and explain ideas in writing.

Taxonomy worksheets, journals, communication skills written assignment.

Problem Solving: Assessment tools, other than exams, that demonstrate competence in computational or non-computational problem solving skills.

Time management assignments, worksheets, role-playing.

Skill Demonstrations: All skill-based and physical demonstrations used for assessment purposes including skill performance exams.

CPR for Healthcare Providers. Industry-relevant communication skills.

Exams: All forms of formal testing, other than skill performance exams.

Quizzes, exams.

Other: Includes any assessment tools that do not logically fit into the above categories.
