3. Organize and create a program or brochure describing a public event.
4. Create a newsletter to distribute news and information to a group.

6. Prepare an informative brochure containing text and graphics.
7. Create and design a publication from a blank page.
8. Produce a multipage publication.
9. Prepare a business form with a table and save it as a template.
10. Create a mail merge with a publication.
11. Create, design, and format web pages for a web site.
