Outcomes and Objectives:

Emphasis on wellness. Care of the obstetrical and pediatric client in a variety of clinical settings (hospital, clinics, nursery school, home and lesidential care settings).

- 1. Demonstrate safety principles in care of postpartum, infants, and pediatric clients (i.e. positioning techniques, and checking I.D. bands).
- 2. Safely administer and document oral and injectable medications.
- 3. Identify rationales and demonstrate ability to apply principles of special precautions (i.e. communicable diseases, universal precautions).

- 3. Normal growth and development from infancy through adolescence.
 - A. Normal newborn, the child, the adolescent.
 - B. Physical, mental, and social needs.
- 4. Care of the sick child.
 - A. Common problems.
 - B. Common nursing procedures.
 - C. Administration of medications.

Assignment:

- 1. Nursing care plans: due each week, one per assigned patient(s).
