Assignment:

Assignments usually include:

1. Experiential games and simulation exercises.
2. Participation in various types of small groups.
3. Field work (field experiment, mock trial).
4. Written midterm (includes reading and textbook). Critical thinking skills exercised as students apply themselves to the midterm's general concepts. Questions refer to leadership, interpersonal orientation, conflict resolution, gender issues and non-verbal communication.
5. Comprehensive Term Paper (indicating ability to apply, analyze, evaluate and synthesize concepts of group dynamics and problem solving), to a specific group of the student's choice.

Methods of Evaluation/Basis of Grade:

Writing: Assessment tools that demonstrate writing skills and/or require students to select, organize and explain ideas in writing.

Reading reports, Essay exams, Term papers
