Assignment:

1. Reading from text and handouts: 20- 40 pages per week.
2. Answer study questions from text (approx. 20 per week) and/or weekly quizzes.
3. Topical research assignments (2-3) and 2-3 page summary for each.
4. Final mock state board exam. Student must achieve a score of 70% or higher to pass the course.

Methods of Evaluation/Basis of Grade:

Writing: Assessment tools that demonstrate writing skills and/or require students to select, organize and explain ideas in writing.
