5. Document accurately with an increased ability to evaluate outcomes.
6. Contribute to the nursing care plans and develop patient-centered teaching skills.
7. Communicate effectively as a member of the multi-disciplinary team.

3. Nursing care of medical surgical pediatric and mental health clients using the nursing process with conditions affecting

  - b) circulatory and respiratory

  - d) digestive and reproductive
  - e) urinary and endocrine
  - f) psychopathology of mental health clients
4. Nursing care of the perioperative surgical client
  - a) Preoperative
    - I. transporting patients
    - II. patient emotional support
  - b) Post-operative
    - I. monitoring vital signs
    - II. charting and reporting
5. Nursing care and nursing care plans of the adult medical surgical, mental health and pediatric client.
6. Clinical pathways and teaching protocols for
  - a) complex medications regimens
  - b) physical assessment
  - c) various medical surgical, pediatric, and mental health disease states
  - d) culturally appropriate care
7. Increased responsibility for patient care and assessments in a variety of settings
