- 4. A final examination based on classroom lecture/discussion and reading
- 5. A research paper of 5-7 pages and/or an oral presentation of 10-15 minutes on a topic within the course based on both primary and secondary sources.
- 6. Optional assignments: Interview, museum visit, field trip reports
