- 4. Develop story ideas, conduct research and interviews and write articles for one of the following sections: news, feature, opinion, sports or arts and entertainment.
- 5. Create a multimedia, social media or mobile journalism news or feature story, using blend of audio, photos, video and text.
- 6. Edit stories for content, Associated Press (AP) Style, grammar and punctuation.
