- 1. Participate in story budget meetings and discuss libel and ethical issues as they apply to news media production.
- 2. Demonstrate ability to help with tasks associated with news production, such as copyediting, headline and cutline writing, photo editing, design, layout, and magazine distribution.
- 3. Develop story ideas, conduct research and interviews, and write articles for two of the following sections: news, feature, opinion, sports or arts and entertainment.
- 4. Create story packages for print or online that incorporate an article, sidebars, charts, illustrations, photos, audio (podcasts), video or other multimedia elements.
- 5. Edit stories for content, Associated Press (AP) style, grammar, and punctuation.
- 6. Demonstrate ability to upload stories and photos to website.
