Outcomes and Objectives:

The students will:

- 1. Develop a terminology to describe stage and dance movements.
- 2. Develop flexibility and orginality in movement.
- 3. Understand and demonstrate changes of tempo, mood and character in dance.
- 4. Utilize techniques of choreography and rehearsal of dance routines for performance.
