Outcomes and Objectives:

The student will be able by the completion of the semester to:

- 1. Analyze and apply rhythm, tempo and dynamics to reading, composing and playing musical scores for dance.

 - c. Analysis of rhythmic components of selected musical works; counterpoint, unison, mixed meter, development of dynamics through rhythm, and use of those elements in creation of movement ideas.
