Reading Course Description

Introductory developmental reading course offers skill-building lessons based on reading material and computer-based exercises to increase reading comprehension.

Reading Course Outcomes and Objectives

By the end of this course, you will have developed critical reading and thinking skills using a wide range of reading materials. Upon completion of this course, you will:

Course Requirements - Both Classes

Reading Class Grading Criteria

Assignments and Attendance: 45%

Various assignments include in-class work and homework. All assignments will receive points and will be based on the new skills you learn throughout the semester.

Lab Hours: 10%

In my class, the computer lab component consists of interactive reading lessons on the computer and other assigned reading activities. You are expected to attend the lab 1.5 hours each week for the reading class and will keep track of your hours each week.

Quizzes: 20%

Quizzes will be given throughout the semester.

Final Exam: 25%
