Please read this entire Syllabus (which is subject to change) and every week read all of the Announcements. In this course you need to be an independent learner who follows the course's directions. This course requires three hours of work for each Module/Lesson, plus the requirement to read your textbook. You will be learning the same material as you would in our face-to-face class on campus. This course has audio lectures with slides. You will also be watching about a half an hour of ethnographic videos each week.

Course Description: Catalog Description

Exploration of human cultural diversity and interrelationships on a global scale. Comparative analysis of traditions such as kinship, child rearing, religion, magic, political systems, relationship to nature, and language.

Requirements:

A computer, a browser which supports Canvas (our learning platform at SRJC), and internet which is powerful and reliable enough to allow you to take this Online SRJC Canvas class. Or you can go to the SRJC library and use their computers to take this course. The Canvas platform does not work with all devices and browsers. Email: This sounds like common sense, but some people have given us invalid emails or even made up fake emails when registering or when completing the Check In process. When we email to these addresses, we get return messages from the email server. Those students don't find out very important information from the instructor and the college (such as that they may be dropped from the class for some reason.) You can purchase this book as a used edition, a new textbook or as an ebook or as a rental book from the BOOKSTORE. If you buy your used textbook from another online retailer (such as Amazon), allow plenty of time for shipping (up to two weeks). You will probably not pass the course quizzes, if you do not have not studied the textbook. You cannot retake a quiz or take a quiz late, for any reason.

2. REQUIRED DVD SERIES: "Cultural Anthropology: Our Diverse World" Two DVD set with a total of seventeen 30 minute episodes. Published by Coast Learning Systems. This series is sold by the SRJC Bookstore. Some students have asked, "Why will we use an older edition of this text, Cultural Anthropology: The Human Challenge?" The answer is that the newest edition, in my opinion, is not substantially different then the old edition. The new edition costs \$200 on Amazon. The used 12th edition costs as little as \$10 (with shipping) or \$59 to rent the ebook (available instantly.) The price of the older edition and the DVD set is less than the cost of the newer textbook. If you buy an earlier or later edition of the text, then the Chapters will not match our class Schedule and you will need to make adjustments on your own.

ADOBE READER: There are some PDFs linked to, make sure you have Adobe Reader (http://get.adobe.com/reader/) installed on

your computer.

You need these materials from the first day of class. In our class you will read one to two chapters in the book, listen to one or two video lectures (with a slide show) watch one or two DVD shows (about 30 minutes long) and then study for the online quizzes each week.

So....wise students will purchase these items immediate, so that they are prepared for the first day of class.

Dropping the Class

If you decide to discontinue this course, it is your responsibility to officially drop it. A student may be dropped from any class when that student's absences exceed ten percent (10%) of the total hours of class time (for online classes the computer records your activity and participation.) It is strongly advised that if you need to miss more than one class/homework deadline in a row that you contact the instructor to see if it is possible to avoid being dropped from the class.

Attendance

For face-to-face courses, students who fail to attend the first class meeting may be dropped by the instructor. For classes that meet online, students who fail to log on and initiate participation by 11:59 p.m. Pacific Time of the first day of the class may be dropped by the instructor.

The instructor will post announcements on the "Instructor Announcements" page in Canvas throughout the semester. Although Canvas notifies students according to their preferred Notification Preferences, you need to check the Announcements button on the Course menu each week.

This class does not have a Forum or Discussion Board for questions. If you email a question to the professor that would be of interest to the entire class, an Announcement will be posted to share the answer with the entire class.

You earn points by taking quizzes and the Final exam, by completing your Museum and Roots reports, and through participation.

A= Earn 270-300 points.

B= Earn 230-269 points.

C or CR= Earn 200-229 points.

D= Earn 170-199 points.

F= Earn 0-169 points.

Please be sure to read all of the information on the course's Canvas website.

The Instructor reserves the right to make minor adjustments to these point levels to account for the distribution of scores in the class. However any adjustments will only benefit the student. (For example if a number of individuals have 199 points, the level to earn a C might be lowered to 199.)

- Quizzes and Final Exam: 180 points (each question is worth one point.)
- Presentation: My Cultural Roots: 70 Points.
- Participation: 15 points To earn these points, you need to complete the assignments (including the Discussions).
- Required SRJC Museum visit: 35 points (These points will be added to your Participation points. This means that a total of 50 points can be earned for Participation. These points will not be added to the Grade Book until the end of the course.

SRJC does not allow the grades of A-, B+, B-, and so on. Instructors can only give "whole grades": A, B, C, D, and F.

Note for classes that are hybrid (with class meetings). You will lose points for participation and for the Roots report (you get points for listening to other students give reports and for your own report) if you do not attend all of the scheduled class meetings. It is unlikely you will be able to earn more than a B grade if you miss (or are more than 20 minutes late) for two or more classes.

Late Policy

All assignments are due by 11:30 p.m. on the due date. Late work will result in a significant reduction in points, if it is not too late for it to be accepted.

Exams

There are frequent quizzes and a final exam. If any quiz or exam is missed, a zero will be recorded as the score. It is your responsibility to take the exams by the due date. Quizzes and the Final Exam may not be taken late for any reason. The online and hybrid version of the class has a number of hours available to take the quiz. The face-to-face classes only have one hour (or less) to take a exam. In both cases, quizzes cannot be 'made up' or retaken.

Except for special circumstances, such as being given permission by the professor to register late for the class, there are no opportunities to earn extra credit. This is because we want you to focus on completing the quizzes and assignments on time, doing the best job you can. Missed guizzes cannot be made up. Please plan accordingly.

If you elect to take the course with a grade of Pass/No Pass you need to earn at least 70% of the total class points.

This course requires you to behave in an ethical manner.

Fair warning regarding cheating: it is embarrassing for me to have to mention this, but college policy dictates a reminder that cheating of any kind is simply not allowed. Very serious consequences will result to everyone involved with giving or getting answers, which could result in those involved not being able to earn enough points to receive a passing grade.

These kind of issues are very rare but I need to mention that if I perceive that cheating, the student is unlikely to earn a passing grade for this class.

Not allowed:

- Sharing any information with anyone about the quizzes.
- Taking photos or recording in any way any aspect of the quizzes.
- · Using course materials or a textbook or notes during a quiz.
- Taking the quiz in with another person (either in person or in another location)

Do not forfeit your good name and credit, nor ask someone else to do so on your behalf. This college rule applies at all times including online in any forum. The college's system has the means of detecting most of the most common means of not completing a quiz in an ethical manner, including loading a quiz more then once, collaborating when taking a quiz or attempting to submit the quiz more then once. By opening any of our quizzes you agree to the following conditions:

"I agree that I will take my quiz in a private location. This means that I will be alone when I take the quiz. I will not give or receive help from another person. I understand that the quiz is to be taken without using my book or notes, just as if I was taking the

class on campus. If I am unable to follow these rules, I will either drop the course or email the instructor to let him know that I need to have arrangements made to have proctored (supervised) tests. If I fail to follow this honor code, I understand that I may receive an "F" or "no credit" for this course."

Each question counts for approximately one point towards your 180 exam points. Some quizzes are longer then others and the final exam is a comprehensive final with questions on all of the material you learned in this course. Quizzes count for 8 to 15 points each and the Final exam counts for 54 points.

There is a Study Guide at the end of each lecture/slide show.

Also, the weekly Overview has the objectives you need to learn for each week. Students who complete all of the activities listed for the Lesson typically pass the course. Many students earn B's and A's, if they have studied all of the Lesson's materials, before taking the exam.

You will have one minute per question on all of the quizzes. (The quizzes have ten to twenty questions and these take 10-20 minutes to complete.) Once you begin a quiz, you must finish it. You are not allowed to save and return to the quiz. All of our tests are timed. You get one minute per question. You need to set a timer when you take the test and not go over the amount of allotted time.

It is a good idea to save on your own computer (or the cloud or another storage method) all Discussion Posts. This is because a few people have the rare issue of not having their work submitted correctly and more importantly, you can use all of the Discussions as material you can include in your Roots Report.

Lecture Videos

Please be sure to allow adequate time when downloading the audio lectures. It may take 1-4 minutes to download each lecture.

When you are listening to some of the lectures you will hear my student assistants describe the photos, so that those who are visually impaired will understand what is on the screen.

NOTE: You are advised to view the PowerPoint audio lectures for the week by each Wednesday (or Thursday morning-at the latest). If you have any problems, follow the suggestions listed in the Tech Help Announcement or click on Help on the bottom of the menu on the left side of the page, so that you are not attempting to view the lectures for the first time on Friday or Saturday, which is when the quizzes must be taken (see the Schedule for the dates for all quizzes and assignments.) Please allow up to two business days (Monday through Friday-closed Saturday and Sunday) for a response to your emails to the instructor or to the Help staff.

Q: Is this course easier then an on campus class?

A: No, it is actually easier to go to an on campus class and have one of our excellent faculty members tell you what to do in the class. In an online class you must be disciplined enough to make yourself take a number of steps on your own each week: watch a video, listen to a lecture, take notes, read the text, take the guiz and do the homework.

Q: I don't have a computer, can I take this class online?

A: You need access to a computer and taking this course is easiest to take if you have access to high speed internet. (Dial up internet will probably be too slow for you to have a good experience.) However you can use the computers at our Libraries to take the entire course, if you wish.

Q: Can I do my weekly work early or late?

A: To receive full credit, you should do the work according to the schedule listed in the website. It is better to be a little early while doing your work then to be late. Points are deducted for late work, except when a student has received some sort of written accommodation from the college.

Q: Can I use a different edition of the text?

A: If you do, it is likely that the chapters will not match our homework schedule.

Q: Once the semester begins, can I switch to a face-to-face section of Anthro 2?

A: Perhaps. You first need to see if you can register for a face-to-face course. Once you are registered for a different section of Anthro 2, then you can drop this class, so that another student can take your place. Your new class is likely to use different textbooks.

Q: If I have a question, what should I do?

A: Immediately email your instructor. You will get an answer within two business days (Monday through Friday), however most of the time I am able to answer emails on the same day. You can email me using the SRJC email: mfanning@santarosa.edu (mailto:mfanning@santarosa.edu)

Q: Can I talk to my instructor?

A: Yes, just email a request for a phone conference.

Q: What time am I suppose to go online?

A: You can go online 24/7, anytime, except when the SRJC servers are down for maintenance.
