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Course Description:

This course is designed for beginning high, non-native English speakers to develop their abilities in English to be able to function independently in everyday situations. There is particular emphasis on vocabulary development, pronunciation and oral language skills needed for real-life situations. This class is recommended for students with concurrent or previous enrollment in ESL 714.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate level-appropriate listening and speaking skills needed to communicate in basic interactions at school, work and in community settings.
- 2. Identify and begin to use culturally appropriate conversation skills including non-verbal skills in simple, real-life settings.

Learning Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

- 1. Improve their English pronunciation in realistic conversations at school, work, and in the community.
- 2. Initiate and conduct a level-appropriate conversation or interview with an employer medical provider or school official.

- 3. Identify academic, vocational, and personal goals and skills needed to achieve these goals.
- 4. Use appropriate language to actively participate in classroom activities.
- 5. Use culturally appropriate communication strategies in group work and individual interactions at school, work and in the community.

Course Materials

Attendance:

- 1. Students are expected to arrive to every class on time and to attend and participate in each class session.
- 2. Students may be dropped from this class if absences exceed ten percent (10%) of the total hours of class time. You may not miss more than 2 full classes or six hours of class during the entire class.

It is the student's responsibility to let the instructor know of their absence ahead of time by telling the teacher in person or by calling, texting or emailing to let her know of the pending absence and the reason you will miss class.

- Complete the CASAS entry and exit exams

Progress (SP) To earn a grade of SP in this class, students must:

- Attend class and participate in class regularly
- Complete assigned homework
- Demonstrate progress toward expected outcomes for this course
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No Pass (NP) Students will earn a grade of NP if they do not:

- Attend or participate in class regularly (missing more than 10% of classes)
- Complete their classwork or homework
- Show progress toward the expected outcomes for this course
- Take the CASAS entry and exit exams

Withdrawal (W) Students will earn a grade of W if they:

• Attend class fewer than 8 hours of class in the semester.
