# **Course Objective and Description:**

CHIN 51 is a First Semester Chinese class in a series which will focus on developing basic skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing in Mandarin for students with no prior background in Chinese language. The first course will focus on the Romanization and sound system of Mandarin Chinese, as well as analytical components of the Chinese character. Students will learn vocabularies that cover basic objects, common measure words, numbers, high frequency place names, and time words.

Each lesson introduces different basics of Chinese syntax and accuracy in word order. Students will practice with master core sentence structure using high-frequency verbs and auxiliary words. By the end of the semester, students will be able to compose short sentences for introductions as well as ask and answer basic conversational questions (e.g., time, weather, family, shopping and transactions). The course adopts a communicative approach and stresses the role of understanding cultural differences.
