**Course Description**: This is a beginning course in floristry. You will learn the correct use of tools, the basic principles and elements in Western Floral Design and the construction of floral designs by lecture, demonstration and lab. We will attend **two field trips.** The trip is to Sequoia Floral where you will see first hand the workings of a wholesale floral business.

We will meet at Sequoia at 1:00pm. On September 18. <u>If unable to attend field trip alternate homework projects will be given.</u>

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Field October 26, San Francisco Flower Market, leaves at 5:45 am, back at 11:30 am. Bus loads at 5:30am, it will not wait for you. Note that this field trip is on a Friday.

#### **Description:**

Fundamentals of design, techniques, and skills practiced in the florist industry. Includes designs, mechanics, and guides to design; introduction to flower and foliage **shapes** and their use; cut flower care; corsage practice; containers and designer aids.

Attendance: Class will start on time. Please be there promptly. MAKE SURE YOUR CELL PHONE IS OFF!! If you miss a class it is up to you to make up the class assignment for your portfolio and get notes from one of your classmates. Credit is

given for each class attended. Please note that if you are ill and email me and make up the project you will be given credit for that class period.

General Information: Each week you will be given an assignment. We will go over in class what you will be doing. You will also be told which container or materials you will need for the following class, as we will use some containers more than once please do not give them away. You will be given all the supplies, flowers, foliages and containers for the projects. The exception is your Mid-term and final you will be responsible for flowers, greens and container. (You may use any of the containers that you were given in class if you choose.)

In case of an emergency evacuation of our class we will meet at the designated area. A map is posted in the classroom and we will go over it during our first class period

## You will be required to keep a notebook and to maintain a portfolio of your work for the semester.

Each class period there will be a corner set up for you to take a picture of your work that week. You will be responsible for your photos. The portfolio will be submitted on **December 11th No late portfolios will be accepted.** 

Do Not Wait until the last minute for your photographs; keep up on your portfolio. Those of you taking credit/no credit are required to do a portfolio if you want credit. <u>To pass this class you must turn in your portfolio.</u> NO EXCEPTIONS you will be doing all the work in class for the portfolio so it is not difficult to keep it up.

**Midterms and Finals** will be done in class.

The Midterm will be October 23th.

The final hands on Project is December 4th

You will need to bring your own flowers, greens and container for your final and midterm. You can use any of the containers from earlier projects or a container that you have as long as it is conducive to the projects we learned in class. Designs will be done in class.
