# **Course Description**

This course covers the popular graphics software program Adobe Illustrator. Topics include the creation, modification and formatting of vector objects and type, importing/exporting graphics, live effects, and other Illustrator tools.

### Required Software

- Adobe Illustrator CC \_(http://www.adobe.com/products/illustrator.html) 2018 version Note: you can use this for free in the campus computer labs, library, and during class. You can also find discounts on the Adobe Creative Cloud at CollegeBuys.org \_(https://shop.collegebuys.org/adobe\_student-c259.aspx?Layout=), or on the Adobe website (http://www.adobe.com/creativecloud/buy/students.html?promoid=65FN7X8B&mv=othe).
- If you have an older version of Illustrator, you should be able to complete most of the assignments for this class. I do not teach to the older versions, so you are responsible for identifying the differences. It will also be your responsibility to contact me in advance and/or find a more current version if you find you cannot complete a project.
- You may need Acrobat Reader to view the PDFs. On the Macintosh, you can also use the Preview app.

# **Dropping the Class**

Grades will be assigned as follows:
