CS 70.11A Photoshop 1 Spring 2019 Syllabus

Welcome to CS 70.11A: Photoshop 1. This class explores the basics of Photoshop, including: selection, layers, painting, image sources and copyright, and resolution. In addition, the class discusses simple automations, image repair, correcting image color and tone, filtering, effects, plus the creation of complex composite images.

This is the entry course to four semesters of Photoshop instruction. Hopefully, you will become so interested in Photoshop that you'll continue on to all the courses. If you complete all four courses, you'll be eligible for the SRJC Photoshop Certificate.

As a student in this class, it is your responsibility to read and completely understand everything that's on this syllabus. This online course is being offered in an accelerated format, which means you will need to be extra diligent in keeping up with the assignments.

Student Learning Outcomes

By completing this course, students will be able to demonstrate competency in identifying Photoshop interface elements, construct simple documents utilizing selections, layers, and blending modes, and differentiate between simple graphic file formats and choose the appropriate usage for each.

Outside of my teaching roles, I own and operate a design firm that specializes in helping early stage ventures with their brand identity and visual design elements, including logo design, software UI design, packaging design, print collateral, and much more. These projects involve the use of Adobe Creative Suite 100% of the time. My goal this semester is to now only guide you through the fundamentals of Photoshop as a tool, but also shed light on how this tool represents a single integral part of an overarching creative process found in professional settings, like design agencies and studios.

Hardware / Software

Adobe Photoshop CC 2015 or higher is required.

If you choose to work at your own computer, you will need to subscribe to Photoshop CC directly from Adobe. You are likely eligible for education discounts as an SRJC Student.

Make sure you check hardware and software requirements before buying and installing any software. Photoshop CC 2015 and up will not run well—or at all—on older computers.

Online Requirements

You will need basic skills for navigating websites and the ability to send and receive email. You must have an email account that you can check on a regular basis.

Photoshop Keyboard Shortcuts

To truly become one with Photoshop, or really any application (especially Adobe), is to learn the keyboard shortcuts. Fundamental understanding and use of shortcuts will enhance your experience ten fold. I strongly recommend beginning your journey with Photoshop by learning the shortcuts from the get-go in your assignments.

Class Communication

It is important to read your class email often. You need to check it at the very least once a week. I will be sending out periodic emails as needed to clarify issues, point out book errors, let you know that grading is done, etc. I will communicate with you solely through Canvas, unless otherwise adjusted and noted.

I check my email often and try to answer emails within a day or two. By using the class discussion forum in Canvas, one of your classmates may also be able to help you.

Assignments

- Post a message to the class discussion forum to see if anyone else is having the same problem, or knows the answer. Typically, several students have the same question and if it is answered publicly, then everyone can benefit.
- YouTube—believe it or not, someone has probably posted an answer to your
 question on YouTube. I am continually amazed at the amount of content that is
 posted on YouTube addressing everyday questions for not only Adobe products, but
 just about every software I use.
- Email me directly. In order for me to read your email, you must include CS 70.11A:
 Subject Matter Here in the subject line. If you have an important question that is keeping you from completing your assignment, also include the word HELP in the subject line.

Quizzes and Exams

This class has weekly quizzes designed to test whether you understood the week's subject. There is also a midterm exam, final exam, and a final project.
