Course Description

The second half of a beginning algebra course, including systems of equations, rational expressions, radicals and rational exponents, quadratic equations, and the graphs of parabolas. The combination of MATH 150A and MATH 150B is equivalent to MATH 151. Not open to those who have taken MATH 151 with a grade of "C" or better.

Prerequisites: Course Completion of MATH 150A

Three midterm exams and a final exam will be given. The final exam is cumulative. You must take the final exam to pass the course. At the end of the semester I will replace a student's lowest midterm exam score with the final exam percentage, if it helps.

Homework

This course will have hand written homework assignments. Homework will be assigned daily and will be due at the start of the following class time. In general, late homework is not accepted. Your lowest two homework assignments will be dropped from your homework average at the end of the semester. Points earned from homework form a score equivalent to 20% of the semester grade.

Grading Policy

Student semester grades are based on performance in each of the categories shown in the table below. A score of up to 100 points is possible for each category. At the end of the semester a final score is determined by weighting the category scores with the percentages given below.

<u>Category</u>	Percentage of Semester Grade
Midterm Exam 1	20%
Midterm Exam 2	20%
Midterm Exam 3	20%
Homework	20%
Final Exam	20%

The final semester score is then converted to a letter grade for the semester using this scale.

A: 90 or better
B: 80 – 89
C: 70 – 79
D: 60 – 69
F: less than 60

For example, suppose a student has the following scores: 1st midterm 75, 2nd Midterm 80, 3rd Midterm 65, homework 90, and final exam 85. In this case the final exam score of 85% replaces Midterm 3, and we get:

Midterm 1	75 x .20 = 15.0
Midterm 2	$80 \times .20 = 16.0$
Midterm 3	85 x .20 = 17.0
Homework	90 x .20 = 18.0
Final Exam	85 x .20 = 17.0
Final Score	total = 83.0

With 83.0, the student earns a B grade.
