#### **Student Learning Outcomes:**

- 1-Analyze the effect of color in floral design.
- 2-Incorporate the different elements of space (positive, negative and voids) into floral arrangements to enhance design effect.
- 3-Effectively integrate textures into floral designs
- 4-Incorporate advanced contemporary floral techniques on a design project for a client.

#### General Information

This class is intended to help the student expand their creativity in the art of floral design. We will be using more advanced mechanics and exploring more design styles during the semester. An introduction to the use of tropical flowers and foliages as well as the proper care and handling of these materials will be part of the class curriculum.

Students are encouraged to "think outside the box" in their use of floral materials and supplies while maintaining the proper elements and principles of design.

I will e-mail your weekly handouts to you on the Monday before class, so please check your e-mail every week. This handout will include what container and any material that will be needed for the following week.
