Counseling 270 is only offered with the Pass/No Pass (P/NP) grading option. This means that if you receive a C or higher, you will earn a P for Pass. If you receive a D or F, you will earn an NP for No Pass. Neither will affect your overall GPA; however, in order to earn the .5 unit, you must pass. In order to pass this course with a P, you must achieve an average score of 70% or above on all the activities, which includes all the forums, assignments, and final project.

The course is worth a total of 100 points. The breakdown is as follows:

- Attendance/Participation: 15 points (3 points for each day of synchronous class)
- Assignments: 54 points (25 points each for Assignments 1 & 2; 4 points for Assignment 3)
- Final Project: 31 points (*you cannot pass the course without completing the Final Project and this will be your exit ticket on the last day of class)

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70-100 points = Pass (P)
