Catalog Description of Course:

This course covers interior design principles and elements; influences of historical, cultural and functional design factors; and the selection and arrangement of interior furnishings and materials. Career options in interior design will be included.

• Eligibility for ENGL 1A or equivalent.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Identify common careers in the interior design field and the education and skills they require.
- Develop and assemble graphical representations that meet a client's specifications and incorporate the elements and principles of design.
- Explore the functional needs of people living in each room of a residence and how those needs might be met. Compare and

analyze design projects for aesthetics, function, universal and sustainable design, and code compliance.

Objectives:

During this course, the students will:

- Analyze the influence of historical and cultural factors in the development of current interior design trends.
- Differentiate among various color systems and use them to create harmonious color schemes.
- Identify the terminology and needs for sustainable and universal design.
- Apply the principles and elements of design to create a functional and aesthetically pleasing interior.
- Prepare and present drawings, graphical information and material boards typical for client presentations.
- Assess personal interests and preferences, and identify career objectives in interior design.
