

**CS 70.11B – Adobe Photoshop 2. Section 4471. 3 units.
Fall 2021. Online.**

Prerequisite: CS 70.11A

Course Description

Adobe Photoshop topics covered in the course include: layers, channel, and mask manipulation; image repair and adjustment; vector graphics and type; actions; and filters.

Student Learning Outcomes

As a result of successful completion of this course, a Student will be able to:

- Outline the differences between masks, channels, and layers.
- Apply image correction techniques to improve images.
- Compare vector-based and pixel-based image, tools, and techniques.

Required Hardware / Software:

- If you choose to work at your own computer, you will need to subscribe to Adobe Photoshop at Adobe.com or CollegeBuys.org.
- Check hardware and software requirements before subscribing to Adobe.com, as Photoshop 2020 and Photoshop 2021 will not run on older computers. Photoshop 2020 or Photoshop 2021 is required.

Methods of Evaluation

5-10% of course grade: Writing - Assessment tools that demonstrate writing skills and/or require the student to select, organize, and explain ideas in writing.

- Written procedural documentation.

10-20% of course grade: Problem Solving - Assessment tools, other than quizzes, that demonstrate competence in computational or non-computational problem-solving skills.

- Creation, manipulation, repair, and analysis of images.

30-50% of course grade: Skill Demonstrations – All skill-based and physical demonstrations used for assessment purposes, including skill performance exams.

- Assignments.
- A self-portrait project is one of the required assignments.

25-45% of course grade: Quizzes - All forms of formal testing, other than skill performance exams.

- Multiple choice, completion, short answer.
- Quizzes will have time limits.
- There will be several short quizzes throughout the semester—as well as a Midterm Quiz and a Final Quiz.
- The material to study for these quizzes can come from the textbook, instructional videos, assigned research, and supplemental materials.

0-10% of course grade: Other – Includes any assessment tools that do not logically fit into the above categories.

- Participation.
- Various classroom discussions.
- Midterm Student/Instructor conference.
