Course Syllabus

Course Description:

Students will learn industry techniques for sewing knitwear apparel including sportswear separates, lingerie, and activewear. Machine skills include use of specialized knit stitches on computer sewing machines, sergers, and cover-stitch machines.

Course Objectives

1. Identify different types of knit fabrics and their weights and stretch ratios.
2. Apply basic fitting and construction techniques for knits.
3. Select suitable patterns and fabrics for a variety of knit garments.
4. Employ machine skills for working with knits on computerized sewing machines, sergers, and cover-stitch machines.
5. Assemble beginning to advanced knit garments implementing techniques unique to knit garment construction.

- 3.2 If individual Instructors wish to distinguish between excused and unexcused absences the instructor shall state in each course syllabus all criteria for any excused absences in addition those required by state or federal law.

4.0 Nonattendance

- 4.1 Students who fail to attend the first two class meetings of a full semester course may be dropped by the instructor.
