Course Description:

This course corresponds to Intermediate French and is designed for students who have had taken French 1 and 2, or who have had two or three years of school in French.

Prerequisites

FREN 2 or three years of high school French

Required texts:

No textbook is required for this course.

The professor will post materials on CANVAS. Students are responsible for checking weekly on the materials posted and using them appropriately based on assignments.

Four 15-min conversations TalkAbroad for a cost of \$30/semester.

Students must pay for the conversations via the TalkAbroad platform.

Learning goals:

During the semester, you will develop literacy skills in French by reading, writing, listening, and talking about various topics. I expect you to spend about 2 to 4 hours per week preparing for class sessions to achieve these goals. Because we know that input and interaction in French are essential to developing proficiency, the class will be conducted entirely in French.

<u>In-class/Zoom participation & Attendance:</u>

Language acquisition requires continuous, constant, daily exposure to meaningful messages in the language you are studying. Success in this class is based on your engagement with texts and activities. You are expected to prepare in advance for each day's learning activities and approach each class period and each learning activity with knowledge of new vocabulary and grammar rules. You are responsible for reviewing all the material covered during homework and classwork. If you cannot attend class, please let your instructors know.

Attendance is mandatory in this course; your instructor will evaluate your attendance and in-class participation every week. You will receive 4 points/week: 2 points/day for attendance and 2 points/day for participation. Being absent from the course will impact the participation evaluation. Your participation grade will be reflected through your engagement in class discussion, group work, and positive attitude towards your peers and instructor. It is your responsibility to come to class prepared and on time.

<u>ZOOM expectations</u>: Students must have their video ON and a working microphone during class sessions. You can use virtual background if necessary.

Class Preparation & Homework:

Class preparation and homework are essential to succeed in this course. Assignments will be posted weekly on the online course management CANVAS. The weekly roadmap will give you detailed instructions on the assignments you have to do and where and when to submit these assignments.

This class comprises two components: a Zoom class session and an asynchronous online session.

- Tuesday Zoom class → students must complete their homework by 4 pm on Tuesday before the class.
- Friday Asynchronous component → students must complete the work listed on Canvas every Friday by 11:50 pm.

Quizzes

You will regularly take short quizzes online to evaluate your learning and understanding of grammar and vocabulary. Being prepared and learning materials are central to this course.

TalkAbroad

By the end of the semester, you will have participated in four 15-minute conversations with Francophone speakers. These conversations will allow you to put your language skills into real-world practice. It will boost your interpersonal skills and intercultural competence. Class time will be devoted to preparing for these conversations. TalkAbroad conversation is a completion grade. You will receive

constructive feedback from your instructor. In addition, you will submit Personal Reflections about your experiences. These reflections will be graded.

Collaborative Reading Project:

Instead of chapter exams, you will engage in various activities centered around literary texts from the French author Philippe Delerm. With your peers, you will read, annotate and comment on three short stories using the social reading platform *Hypothes.is* embedded in Canvas. At the end of the semester, you will create your own short stories and present them as a final digital project, including voice-over, images, and captions.

Final Project:

The final project will replace the traditional final exam and be presented during final exam week. Students' presence is crucial to succeeding in this final project. There will be NO makeup. Class time is devoted to working on the final project.
