About this Course

This course covers the beginning skills of image production and manipulation, using the industry-standard Adobe Photoshop to work with digital images for both Web and print use.

You will have the opportunity to practice using industry-standard applications as well as learn the fundamental elements behind visual design.

Throughout your projects and exercises, you will explore industry practices and standards, design elements, and multi-media applications. All exercises will explore the use of digital design tools, and projects will focus on communicating concepts to an audience.

At the conclusion of this course, you should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate competency in identifying Photoshop interface elements.
- 2. Construct simple documents utilizing selections, layers, and blending modes.
- 3. Differentiate between simple graphic file formats and choose the appropriate usage for each.

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Course Goals

Below is a list of specific skills this course is designed to guide you towards obtaining. Each assignment you complete in this course will contribute to your growth towards meeting these goals. After this class has ended, it is my hope that you will use these skills in your daily life.

- 1. Differentiate among panels, tools, menus, and commands.
- 2. Compare and contrast JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) and PSD (Photoshop Document) image file formats.
- 3. Create at least two images using various painting tools and options.
- 4. Construct selections using at least three selection tools and techniques.
- 5. Differentiate between screen and print resolution, set up digital camera images for printing, and scan an image for print using a flatbed scanner.
- 6. Assess the copyright status of publicly accessible images such as those found on the Internet and in books and magazines.
- 7. Evaluate an image's exposure and tonality, decide which of Photoshop's different tools and commands to use to make necessary adjustments, and repair the image using the appropriate tools and commands.
- 8. Compare image adjustments made directly to an image (Destructive) with ones made using adjustment layers (non-Destructive).
- 9. Repair image defects and damage using the Image/Adjust Menu, Spot Healing, Healing Brush, and Red Eye tools.
- 10. Manipulate and organize images using Adobe Bridge.
- 11. Create at least two multi-layered documents that incorporate layer groups and a variety of blending modes and opacities.
- 12. Evaluate the proper usage of the Liquify, Clouds, Difference Clouds, Motion Blur, and Lens Flare filters.

Keeping in mind that the future is unknown, classroom activities focus on preparing students to leave with the capacity to embrace, critique, and respond to media and design changes.

Notification Settings

Discussion Board Assignments Feedback

I will be posting replies to discussion boards each week. My replies may be in response to an individual's post, but these will be intended to be read by the entire class. At the end of each module, I will send a reminder to review these discussions and search for my name so that you can learn from me (and from each other) throughout the course.

Discussions will each have a rubric attached, and grading will be based on these rubrics, which will also indicate your level of achievement. If any points are reduced, you will receive a guidebook comment explaining why you received reduced points and how you can remedy this to earn full credit.

Written Assignments Feedback

My goal is to give you feedback on written assignments within 3 days of the beginning of the week following the assignment due date, or before those assignments are needed for a subsequent task (if in the same week).

Netiquette Rules and Guidelines for a Productive and Effective Online

Experience

- It is expected that every class member will participate in a mature and respectful fashion.

- Pay close attention to what your classmates write in their online comments. Ask clarifying questions, when appropriate. These questions are meant to probe and shed new light, not to minimize or devalue comments.

 before posting, and refrain from using social media abbreviations. Remember don't type in all capital letters, it is the online
 equivalent to yelling and is considered rude. Be careful with the use of humor and sarcasm, as both can be easily
 misunderstood without the benefit of seeing facial expressions and hearing inflection or tone of voice.
- · Assume the best of others in the class and expect the best from them.
- Value the diversity of the class. Recognize and value the experiences, abilities, and knowledge each person brings to class.
- Disagree with ideas, but do not make personal attacks. Do not demean or embarrass others. Do not make sexist, racist, homophobic, or victim-blaming comments at all.
- Be open to being challenged or confronted on your ideas or prejudices.
