Course Description

Beginning Volleyball Description: This course will introduce students to fundamentals, team concepts, and rules of the game of volleyball. Students will participate in two-person, three-person, four-person, and six-person competition

Intermediate Volleyball Description: Presentation of intermediate-level volleyball skills, participation in match play, and a review of the rules of the game. Improvement of individual skills, team techniques, and game strategies will be emphasized.

Advanced Volleyball Description: Theory and practice of advanced volleyball. Advanced techniques and tactics of tournament competition. This class will include drills, practice, and an intensive review of rules and tournament play.
