Welcome – This class is all about learning to see the world around you. No prior drawing experience is needed—just curiosity and a willingness to experiment. We'll focus on drawing from direct observation, practicing how to look closely at objects, spaces, and environments. By the end of the semester, you'll be better at noticing details, improving your hand-eye coordination, and developing your own visual language.

We'll also explore how drawing can be a way to express ideas and ask questions. We'll look at both historical and contemporary artists for inspiration, learning how different approaches to drawing can inform your own work.

Classes will include short demonstrations, hands-on studio time, group critiques and discussions.

Learning Outcomes – Students will:

- Create/revise compositions using varied tools/techniques.
- Learn how to make objects look three dimensional with light and shadow and learn how to draw in one and two-point perspective.
- Critically evaluate work and compile a skill-based portfolio.

Evaluation & Grading – Based on attendance, class performance, skill growth, and understanding of concepts.

- A (Excellent): 87%+ coursework, 85%+ homework, ≤3 absences, strong participation, originality, risk-taking.
- **B**: 80%+, ≤3 absences, above-average participation, meets objectives.
- **C:** Meets minimum requirements; lack of motivation, unfinished work, or poor attendance lowers grade.

- D/F: Incomplete work, poor ethic, or excessive absences.
- **P:** Meets minimum requirements, portfolio submitted.

Weights: Participation 20% (attendance, preparedness, critiques), work ethic, attendance (>3 absences = drop in grade; 8 = possible drop; 3 tardies/early leaves = 1 absence), homework (A only, 1–2 hrs/week, 85%+ complete, no make-ups), conduct (respectful environment; no food, excess talking, cell phone use; headphones only during drawing).

Sketchbook Required for A grade!(daily drawing; periodic checks),
