# **Course Description**

Fire 71 is a 3-unit core Fire Technology course that provides an overview to fire protection and emergency services, career opportunities in fire protection and related fields; culture and history of emergency services, fire loss analysis; organization and function of public and private fire protection services; fire departments as a part of local government, laws and regulations affecting the fire service, fire service nomenclature, specific fire protection functions, basic fire chemistry and physics, introduction to fire protection systems, introduction to fire strategy and tactics and life safety initiatives.

The best way to navigate the class is to use the modules and select "Next" at the bottom of each page, ensuring you don't miss any content. Quizzes are required for 14 Units to assess your knowledge of the subject. There will be no quiz for Units 15 or 16. This time should be spent on your final assessment, which is an in-depth reflection on what you learned from the class, presented in an Adobe Express video. This Adobe Express peer-reviewed assessment will be seen as your final exam as well as graded by the instructor.



# **Dropping the Class**

#### **Attendance**

# **Late Policy**

All assignments, discussions, and quizzes are due in Canvas at 11:59 PM [Pacific Standard Time] on the due date. Late submissions will receive a 10% daily grade reduction for up to 5 days. Any assignment not completed will receive a zero. As you know, submissions that are more than one week late are not accepted without prior arrangements. Some modules allow you to return and submit past-due assignments for partial grades. The mandatory assignments for your final Adobe Express presentation are required to pass the class. Look for Extra Credit discussions in the modules to make up missed points.

#### **Quizzes and Assessments**

There are 14 online quizzes. The midterm is not your typical exam assessment. The midterm will be a student reflection of the materials covered in the text and online materials. The final exam will incorporate information from the texts and lessons presented in Adobe Express. The material for the quizzes comes from the textbook and lessons. A zero will be recorded as the score if any quiz or assessment is missed. You should take the quizzes by the due date. The final assessment is an in-depth reflection of what you learned about your chosen subject from the class. The presentation submittal will be due the week before the final Module, and the peer review will be the last discussion assignment to complete the class. Because of your busy lives, two of the lowest quiz scores will be dropped from the final score.

# Adobe "<u>Express (Links to an external site)</u> ⊕ (https://www.adobe.com/express/) " Presentation

Students ARE REQUIRED to complete the final assessment Adobe Express "web page" presentation as the final exam. It will consist of at least 15 pictures but no more than 20. (Students who choose not to submit a presentation will receive an F for the course.) The presentation will reflect what the student has learned from the class as described on the assignment page or as approved by the instructor. The presentation can focus on student interests such as fire training, laws, prevention, protection systems, fuel management, emergency operations, etc. The presentation must include the works cited within the presentation. This assignment will be broken into three mandatory submittals. The final submittal will be the whole presentation. The presentation must be submitted through Canvas (Assignment Link). Grades for late presentations won't be accepted unless you make arrangements prior to the deadline. The due date is provided on the Unit Content Table. Please review the Rubric for the Presentation on the assignment page. All three submittals are REQUIRED MANDATORY assignments. Students who do not complete the assignments FAIL the course.

Start looking in your local area or the news for pictures you want to use in your presentation.

Contact the instructor if you are a visually disabled student and need an alternative assignment.

#### **Online Discussion Attendance**

Networking is vital for firefighters and fire service professionals at all levels. More than likely, each of you will only know someone in the class. As the instructor, I added a Q&A Discussion Board called "Fire House Kitchen Table". It is available for student interaction with each other and will not be monitored, allowing you to ask and answer questions among yourselves. We will have some seasoned firefighters and fire professionals in the class, making it an excellent opportunity to network and ask questions of one another. Since I will not monitor the Fire House Kitchen Table, please be professional and polite. Since participation in online classes is essential, we will have a group discussion in every module using different tools. Discussions are so vital that they are worth 20% of the grade. There are posted questions to start the discussion, but you can also comment on what you perceive or think. Make sure to explain your observation in detail. Feedback is essential, so comment back to another student to receive the full 20 points.

#### **DIRECTIONS for Discussion Success:**

Discussions will be shared throughout the class. You'll need to participate in the discussion during the week specified in the module dates to receive full credit. Students must post their first response by Tuesday at 11:59 PM and provide at least one comment on other students' posts by Thursday at 11:59 PM. The first and additional posts must be at least 100 words or more. Your first post will be worth 15 points, and your comment on a student's post will be worth 5 points.

I leave all discussions open during class for students who wish to continue the dialogue. However, according to the calendar of events, the discussions are graded shortly after the week they are due.

Discussions and Assignments may be posted using VoiceThread (VT), Canvas Studio, PlayPosit, or other applications to promote class involvement. The requirements for these discussions will be outlined on the Unit's Discussion Page. Follow the Rubric for full points.

# **Grading Policy**
