Emphasis is on identifying interests, personality testing, values clarification, career information, research skills, individual skills assessment, decision-making, communication, teamwork, inter-professional education, and goal setting in the healthcare field. The course also covers healthcare job trends, education, and licensure requirements.

## **Late Policy**


- Pre-work and readings must be completed before Thursday meetings.
