- 1. Demonstrate an ability to perform selected advanced vocational nursing skills in a simulated clinical setting (laboratory) which is consistent with theoretical knowledge base and common standards of practice.

Topics and Scope:

- A. Fluid and Electrolytes:
 - 1. Intravenous therapy.
 - 2. IV site care.
 - 3. Regulating and monitoring IV's; calculating drip factors.

B. Procedures:

- 1. Sterile wound irrigations and packing to include: wound drainage systems and bladder irrigations.
- 2. Chest tubes (monitoring and care).
- 3. Tracheostomy care.
- 4. Team leading skills (transcribing orders and shift reports).

Assignment:

- 1. Attend scheduled demonstration of identified nursing skills.
- 2. Practice identified nursing skills in the laboratory.

- 3. Safely perform successful check-offs with instructors of identified nursing skills through a return demo examination.
- 4. Practice utilizing a team approach with different roles being accountable for the team's performance.
