COURSE CONTENT

Outcomes and Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate improvisational creativity through concentrated study of a small number of jazz compositions.
- 2. Demonstrate listening and performance skills related to interaction with other musicians.
- 3. Students repeating Jazz Combo Ensemble will be able to perform more difficult repertoire and perform with a higher level of musicianship.

Topics and Scope:

- 1. Concentrated study of 3 to 5 jazz compositions to maximize opportunities for creative improvisation.
- 2. Ensemble playing skills such as intonation, rhythmic precision, and dynamics.
- 3. Public performance in a variety of environments: classroom, outdoor, jazz festival, and

concert hall.

- 4. In-concert performance with professional guest artists when scheduled.
- 5. Students repeating Jazz Combo Ensemble will perform more advanced repertoire each semester, enhancing their skill level, knowledge of the repertoire, and command of improvisational techniques.

Assignment:

- 1. In-class rehearsal and preparation of designated works.
- 2. Preparation and performance of improvised solos.
- 3. A minimum of one hour of outside practice per week is required for each hour of rehearsal.
- 4. Final exam will be a public concert.
- 5. Students repeating Jazz Combo Ensemble will be held to higher standards of performance with each repetition.
