Objectives:

At the conclusion of this course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Accurately interpret and perform college-level classic and contemporary symphonic band literature with proper characteristic tone.
- 2. Demonstrate technical proficiency in the performance of selected literature with emphasis on improvement of endurance and dynamic range.
- 3. Sight read college-level symphonic band literature on a wind or percussion instrument with improved accuracy.
- 4. Perform effectively with an ensemble in a public setting.
- 5. Evaluate and critically analyze their musical performance for future improvement.

Students repeating Symphonic Band will be able to:

1. Demonstrate greater technical achievement on their instrument.

- 2. Articulate musical phrases with greater clarity.
- 3. Perform with higher standards of intonation.
- 4. Demonstrate a more sophisticated comprehension of dynamics, phrasing, musical expression, and nuance.
- 5. Demonstrate greater skill in sight-reading.
- 6. Perform a more extensive repertoire.

Topics and Scope:

Music rehearsal is a fully-integrated experience that encompasses both lecture and lab activities.

- I. Continued Work on Characteristic Tone with Emphasis on Improving Endurance and Control of Dynamic Range
- II. Sight-Reading of College-Level Literature for Symphonic Band
- III. Rehearsal and Public Performance of Classic and Contemporary Works for Symphonic Band
- IV. Study of Particular Technical Challenges Specific to the Literature Studied
- V. Wind instrument articulation techniques specific to the literature studied
- VI. Special Emphasis on Intonation, Particularly Tuning of Chords, Unison Lines, and Problematic Notes on the Instruments
- VII. The Components of Musical Expression such as Phrasing, Dynamic Contrast, and Nuance
- VIII. Differences in Musical Style Specific to the Literature Studied
- IX. Critical Analysis and Comparison of the Different Artistic Goals Specific to the Literature Studied
- X. Performance Etiquette and Proper Performance Attire

Students repeating Symphonic Band will perform new literature each semester, building on both their skill level and knowledge of the repertoire.

Assignment:

Rehearsal (lecture/lab) Assignments:

- 1. Prepare assigned works for public performance in concert
- 2. Outside practice of their instrument (ungraded)

Out-of-Class (lab) Assignments:

- 1. Participation in additional rehearsals, when called
- 2. Participation in concerts, tours, and other field trips as scheduled
- 3. Final exam will be a public concert

Repeating students will be held to higher standards of performance with each repetition.
